## SA URBAN FORESTS – MILLION TREES PROGRAM EVENTS

### 18 June – Para Woodlands, Kalbeeba

These plantings are an important step in this long-term project which aims to re-establish native vegetation including the critically endangered Peppermint Box (*Eucalyptus odorata*) Grassy Woodland and to provide habitat for fauna in decline.

**Date:** Saturday 18<sup>th</sup> June

**Time:** 10am - 3pm (approx)

**Place:** 3km southeast of Gawler (off Allendale Road).

**Notes:** Please bring sun/rain protection, gloves for planting, rubber boots, snacks and water. A catered lunch will be provided.

### 2 July – Gawler Buffer

Help transform former agricultural land into a valued open space reserve and resource for local residents, as well as restoring the Mallee Box (*Eucalyptus porosa*) Grassy Woodland using seed collected locally.

**Dates:** Saturday 2<sup>nd</sup> July 2011

**Time:** 10am - 1pm (approx)

**Place:** The Site 2 is near the Telstra (Communications Tower) off of Smith Rd, Evanston South.

**Notes:** Please bring sun/rain protection, gloves for planting, sturdy footwear, snacks and water. Hot drinks provided.

### 9 July – Craighburn Farm

Contribute to the restoration of Grey Box (*Eucalyptus microcarpa*) Woodland, currently a threatened ecosystem, by joining local residents in restoring local native plants to the Sturt River catchment.

**Place:** End of Bonython Way, Craighburn Farm.

## 23 July – Port Willunga

The site is a former horse paddock that has been the focus of revegetation and weed control activities over the last few years. Volunteers are needed to help re-establish 2,000 more local native plants as part of stage 2 of this restoration project that has shown great success so far.

**Time:** 10am - 3pm (approx)

**Place:** Port Willunga Creek MT site, north of Aldinga Arts Eco Village, off Old Coach Road (UBD Map 224, A1B1). Plenty of parking available, off Old Coach Road, before the roundabout.

**Notes:** Please bring sun/rain protection, gloves for planting, sturdy footwear, snacks and water. Hot drinks provided.

In the City of Salisbury, help transform an engineered drain and adjacent paddock into a corridor of Mallee Box (*Eucalyptus porosa*) Grassy Woodland in an effort to link existing roadside vegetation throughout the Edinburgh Parks area, improving habitat in a region where a high proportion of vegetation has been cleared.

**Time:** 10am – 1.30pm (approx)

**Place:** Edinburgh Biodiversity Corridor Edinburgh Road, Edinburgh (near railway line)
